Planning Commission; Meeting held on July 2, everyone was present. Mary Miller was a guest. Paul talked with a representative from Citizen State Bank concerning borrowing money to fix the roads. The loan would be an unsecured loan for 10 years. It was decided this would not be a viable solution for the road issue. He also looked into Municipal Bonds, which should only be used for amounts of no less than 2 million. Linda talked to Steven's Engineering about putting out bids for the roads (instead of having the county do it). The Town would be responsible for the engineering of the project as well as the inspection afterwards; the bid would maybe be a dollar more than the county. With the county the engineering is already done and we don't have to pay for the inspection when complete. Steven's recommended not doing it. It was decided we will send a mailing to all residents alerting to the project and invite them to the final meeting on August 6. Linda will take care of this.

Roads:

Paul attended a TRIP meeting last week.

There is still some road maintenance to do yet this summer, mowing, fixing the structure on 160th and pot holes.

Chairman: Don Shomaker called and talked to Paul concerning a animal control person. This person would come in and take care of everything, pick up the dog, kennel it and get it shots if necessary, all for a fee.

Something we may look into.

All Croix Inspection asked that when Linda received a Special assessment from a title company she alert them to All Croix so they can make sure there is a completion permit on the property.

Public comment: Herman Zuettel was present to share his thoughts on the possible referendum question concerning the use of Cannabis for medical purposes.
