They worked on reviewing ordinances; Subdivision Ordinance and the needs assessment/Impact fees.

Agenda:

Wyatt Porter – 2 lot CSM – was approved; motion by Wynveen/Miller second.

Roads:

The Walquist bridge should get approval, the town will be responsible for 20% of cost. The culvert on 190th Street and 90th Ave. that is need of replacement, it is covered by the 50/50 program from the county, the cost is approximately \$10,000 for the town.

The trees on the curve of 160th need to be removed, there is approximately 160 trees. The owners will be notified.

Chairman report: Paul elaborated a little more on the work we have done concerning the RR crossings in the Town. We will be stripping them in the spring, adding the reflective tape on the stop signs and adding a stop sign on 160th.

Worked some on the comprehensive plan, waiting for census data.

The Baldwin airport was notified that the debris left from the cutting of their trees need to be removed from the drainage area before the spring thaw.

Next meeting scheduled for March 21, 2022.
