The commission discussed completing the comprehensive plan with other towns, decided we would do our own.

Roads:

200th culvert by south of Kusileks dredged to avoid future flooding. The 90th street culvert replaced. Linda will send statement to Vasfaret for payment.

The town received an itemized bill from the county for the flooding damage. We will be discussing this further at the next meeting.

Chairman: The board decided we will continue doing our own comprehensive plan vs. going with the county and a few other towns. We will be paving the back of the parking area. It will be 2" thick, it is approximately 260x128, Linda will post for bids.

Proposed building addition, Cedar Corp. will do the drawing for us and have ready for next meeting.

The loggerhead Shrick bird nesting season will end on Aug. 1 (proposed Sharylynn development).

Last month had a discussion about paying for fire numbers. At this time, we will leave payment for signs as we have done in the past.

Next meeting scheduled for August 8, 2022.

Being no other business, the meeting was adjourned, motion by Anderson/Miller second.
