Planning Commission; Met on October 2, 2023, Leon Hawkins, Joe Miller and Greg O'Connell were absent.

Paul discussed the Farmland Preservation Program. Paul said the township needs to be 80% Ag 1 or Ag 2, we don't have enough to apply. Individual can apply on their own.

There was discussion on increasing cost of punches of recycling cards, proposing 2 punches per large bag. Also discussed was raising the cost of recliners and couches with recliners.

The Baldwin Airport has a conditional use permit for an addition to the current structure.

The Jenson Property on highway 12 has been cleaned up to meet DOT requirements.

Agenda:

Rick Kuebker – drainage issue: motion by Wynveen/Miller second for the Town of Hammond to pay for the drain pipe and tile to run the water away from the Kuebker property, cost \$2761.

Lindsay Olson – CSCR Bleachers; motion by Anderson/Wynveen second to have the Rec install bleachers on the current cement pads. The bleachers must be anchored to the cement. They will be paying for the bleachers.

Recycle Center Fees: motion by Joe/Anderson second to leave the cost of a bag of garbage the same (1 punch per bag). Sarango Property: Paul gave an update on the inspection of the building, there is no final yet. Linda was in contact with All-Croix concerning if this should be a commercial permit. The DOR has also been made aware. More complaints about the parties and noise.

The budget was reviewed and will be ready for the November meeting.

Roads:

The stop sign at 100th and 170th will be update with the new signs, the stop ahead sign will have reflective tape applied and a spinner on the top.

Chairman: Discussion on what effect reaching a population of 3000 will have on the Town, it doesn't appear to be to much of a change. At the county meeting ADU (accessory dwelling units) were discussed. This is in the early stages they will be more discussion at the WTA meeting.
