Planning Commission:

Paul Discussed the surveying of the trees on 160th with map of site line.

Paul updated on the Solar farm, size has been scaled back. He talked about the Town becoming an intervenor and hiring a law firm to represent the town.

Agenda:

Pickle ball courts: A vote was taken and a motion was made to not put in a pickle ball court as this time and designate funds towards road projects in the budget; motion by Wynveen/Aune second.

Resolution 2025-02 Treasures tax bond approval; motion by Anderson/Miller second.

Pavilion Roof: Week of November 9 completion, \$3350 total cost.

Budget Approval: motion by Miller/Wynveen second with amendment to move pickle ball funds to Highway.

Survey Map – Row Trees on 160th; County did a survey map of the trees, most of the trees are in the ROW and may be removed, no markers have been set. The Town is waiting for the markers before making any more decisions.

Rolling Hills/Pine Lake CD; Leave CD's the same for now; motion by Wynveen/Miller second.

Solar Project: Paul presented the case of the Town becoming an intervenor. He will be contacting a few law firms who are familiar with Solar Projects. He will get some numbers together concerning the cost to the Town and come back to the board for approval.

Roads: Paul and Joe did the road inspection and all our roads are in pretty good shape. Shouldn't have to do anything other than maintenance next year. Paul said he is going to apply for LRIP money as there seems to be a larger amount of funds available. We have ten years to use the funds if approved.
